1. Participation

Student will participate in weekly discussion forums with their peers. This includes one original posting and a minimum of two replies to their peers.

2. Learning Needs Assessment

Students will identify a minimum of two learning needs from their practice. Students will outline how they assessed their practice to come up with the learning needs.

3. Learning Plan

Students will develop a learning plan including the development of SMART (Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Timely) learning goals from their learning needs assessment. Students will identify resources to meet their learning goals, strategies to achieve the learning, and an evaluation plan to evaluate their learning.

4. Professional Portfolio

Students will create a professional portfolio that they can use with potential employers when applying for jobs upon completion of the PN program.

LATE ASSIGNMENTS

To obtain credit in the course ALL assignments, examinations, and knowledge checks must be completed. Students are expected to make every effort to complete assignments on time. Late assignments will have 5% of total marks (or one letter grade) for the assignment deducted for each day/partial day (including weekend days) beyond the due time.

For example, a paper marked at B+ would receive an adjusted grade of B if handed in one day late. After 5 days, a grade of 0 will be awarded to the assignment. If the late penalty places the grade below the necessary pass grade, students will be unsuccessful in the course. When submitting assignments electronically, it is the student's responsibility to ensure the assignment has been received. Papers/assignments may not be rewritten for a higher grade.
