Course Perspective:

AR 3410 will explore the use of monochromatic and color media in drawing. Various methods of representing space and describing the human form will be explored. Development of a personal style

will be encouraged.

Course Content:

Upon completion of the course the student will be able to:

1. Learn the basic principles of two-dimensional design; line,

shape, value, texture, color, tone and composition.

2. Manipulate the elements of visual art on a two-dimensional surface through the application of depth of depth perception(overlapping, mechanical perspective, diminishing size and detail, tonal

modeling).

3. Perceive visual relationships in the environment and record these

perceptions in terms of the elements of visual arts.

4. Exhibit a basic working knowledge of the fundamental techniques and materials of drawing including the use of pencil, conte, charcoal, pen and ink, brush, watercolor, colored pencils and col-

lage.

5. Development the basic skills to render and record the human

form.

- Evaluation Criteria: 1. The level of creativity and craftsmanship demonstrated.
 - 2. The degree of knowledge and understanding of the elements and principles of this particular studio discipline.
 - 3. Portfolio presentations will be required throughout the duration of this course.
 - 4. Professional orientation as indicated by enthusiasm, commitment, involvement and flexibility in collective and individual critiques.

Attendance:

Students can expect to put in a minimum of 10 hours per week on outof-class work. Assignments will be expected on the date required. Failure to complete projects on time for class critiques will effect the student's final evaluation.

Punctuality is exceptionally important as most classes begin with a presentation. More than 20% absenteeism from class will result in the student being asked to leave the class.

The following procedure will be followed:

- 1. A letter will be given to the student informing them that they have been absent 20 % of the class.
- 2. Their name will be forwarded to the Student mentor and Retention program for follow up.

After I week a letter will be sent to the Registrar informing them that the student is being asked to leave the class due to absenteeism.

Further, if students fail to complete and submit 85% of the grade requirements of the term mark they will not be allowed to complete the course. In such a case, the student will automatically receive a failing grade of DB (debarred). See p.23 of the 1999/2000 Calendar for more details.
