CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: The organization of human productive energy is the central focus of this introductory course. Themes of balancing task, relationship requirements and the needs of the organization with those of the individual are stressed. Specific topics include: perception, personality, values, attitudes, motivation, group behavior, and teamwork.

DELIVERY MODE(S):

This is a paced online self-study course. You will work through the course content in the order presented, completing all textbook readings, chapter exercises, discussions, quizzes, and assignments before progressing to the next week. Please adhere to the tentative weekly schedule.

The course is delivered entirely online using NWP MyClass software and the Pearson MyLab site. For each chapter, a MS PowerPoint presentation is available. Relevant MyLab exercises (not graded) for each chapter will be assigned, as well as chapter quizzes (graded) to test your knowledge, understanding, and application of the material throughout the course. You will be evaluated several times so you can assess how you are doing as you work through the material. There will also be periodic discussion forums (graded) to complete. The exercises, assignments, discussions, and quizzes have specific due dates to keep you on track, so you will finish the 15-week course on time. You may complete some of these evaluations before their due dates, with the exception of the tests.

It is highly recommended that you take advantage of all the material on the MyClass course and Pearson MyLab website. Access to MyLab comes with the purchase of your textbook. Important information, announcements, and grades are posted on the NWP MyClass course site. Grades for exercises, assignments, and tests are also posted to the NWP MyClass gradebook. Please check your MyNWP account for your final letter grade after the completion of the course.

- 1. Determine the meaning of Organizational Behavior.
- 2. Recognize how perception, personality, values and attitudes can impact the workplace.
- 3. Implement the concepts of teamwork and recognize its use in the workplace.
- 4. Recognize how effective interaction can occur to achieve cohesive work groups.
