COMPETENCIES

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

COMPETENCY 1

Subtopics

- Benefits of parent involvement for children, parents, caregivers/teachers, and programmes.
- Attitudes towards parent involvement. (i.e. personal values and beliefs, parent's attitudes and beliefs)
- The role of the parent versus the role of the caregiver/teacher.
- Parent involvement models e.g. parent co-ops, home-based, school/centre based.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

COMPETENCY 2

The student will know how to develop meaningful parent involvement programmes.

Sub-topics

- Goals and objectives for parent involvement.
- Strategies/techniques for meeting the goals/objectives of parent involvement. (e.g. brochures, parent resource questionnaires)
- The role of the caregiver/teacher or administrator in involving parents in their children's programmes.
- Guidelines for parent playroom/classroom volunteers.
- Techniques for involving parents who cannot participate in the programme.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

COMPETENCY 3

The student will demonstrate ways of maintaining parent involvement in programmes.

Sub-topics

- Barriers to effective communication between parents and teacher/caregivers.
- Review of principles of active listening.
- Parent concerns.
- Techniques for communicating with parents e.g. general: newsletters, handbooks, bulletin boards; individual: day-to-day encounters, telephone calls, notes, individual conferences, home visits.
- Parent meetings; purpose, type, planning.
