This course provides private study of one's principal instrument or voice. A brief performance for the faculty of the department is required at the end of each semester. This course is restricted to students in the Interactive Digital Design program. Notes: Audit restrictions may

Course Content:

This is the applied lesson for students registered in the Interactive Digital Design program. Lessons are weekly, with weekly assignments designed to encourage incremental growth in

your skills.
