Applied Study: Composition

- Course Description: This course is designed for students with a background
 in theory and music history. It is not a university transfer credit course and is
 primarily designed for students in the Interactive Digital Design Program.
- 2. The Course in Perspective: The purpose of this course is to introduce the fundamental principles and practices of composition approached through written assignments, critical listening, aural training and the composing of original works.
- Assignments: Students will have regular reading, research, studio and written assignments.
- 4. Grading: The student's grade will be determined by the following weighting:
- A) 20% for classroom participation and tests
- B) 30% for weekly composition miniatures
- C) 50% for scores and portfolio
- Topics: Composition techniques and languages, advanced harmony, jazz chords, minimalism, sound mass, serialism, aleatory, parallelism, pentonicism, total instrument, computer generated sound, and the composer's toolbox.
- 6. Text: There is no required text for this applied study.
