COURSE: ENGLISH 1111 H,I,& J Language, Literature, and Culture: Prose Genres and Related Arts

<u>CREDIT</u>: 3(3.0) UT(3) TIMES: 2009 Fall 3 classroom hours per week and a minimum of 13 weeks of instruction. Not to be taken by students with credits in EN 1010 or EN 1000 or EN 1011 or EN 1012, or EN 1202. *Students transferring to U. of Alta must take EN 1111 in combination with EN1112.* Together these courses transfer to all Alberta universities and most Canadian universities. DESCRIPTION and OBJECTIVES:

This course focuses on the specifically literary and more broadly cultural uses of the English language in its many manifestations, through a study of a variety of prose genres and forms. Students should expect to encounter short fiction, novels, and creative non-fictional prose, as well as some of the following: film and visual media, cyber media, orature, and other forms of cultural communication. The goals of the course are to introduce students to the discipline of English, and to the ways in which those in that discipline think about and analyze literary and everyday language practices. Students learn critical skills in reading, writing, and thinking as they relate to social and cultural experience, including literary criticism.

REQUIREMENTS:

Essays lose substantial grades if they are less than the minimum length. (One should not include quoted support in calculating minimum length). All essays must be typed, including in-class assignments if possible, with 25 lines per page, 12 pt font (Times Roman or equivalent), 2.5 to 3 cm margins. MLA standards are required for documentation and format. The instructor must be notified in advance of unavoidable absences. Students that miss several classes may be requested to withdraw from the course due to the great difficulty in catching up on concepts missed. Assignments must be handed in on the date due to avoid specified penalties. *Penalties for plagiarism (see pg.49 in GPRC Calendar) are enforced* and plagiarism is reported to administration. Essays more than 3 days late may not be accepted without prior permission. Late essays will be penalized.
