COURSE: *ENGLISH 1111 Language, Literature, and Culture (Part I): Prose Genres and Related Arts*

CREDIT: 3(3.0) UT(3) **TIMES:** 2008 Fall 3 classroom hours per week and a minimum of 13 weeks of instruction. Not to be taken by students with credits in EN 1010 or EN 1000 or EN 1011 or EN 1012, or EN 1202. *Students transferring to U. of Alta must take EN 1111 in combination with EN1112.* Together these courses transfer to all Alberta universities and most Canadian universities. DESCRIPTION and OBJECTIVES:

This course focuses on the specifically literary and more broadly cultural uses of the English language in its many manifestations, through a study of a variety of prose genres and forms. Students should expect to encounter short fiction, novels, and creative non-fictional prose, as well as some of the following: film and visual media, cyber media, orature, and other forms of cultural communication. The goals of the course are to introduce students to the discipline of English, and to the ways in which those in that discipline think about and analyze literary and everyday language practices. Students learn critical skills in reading, writing, and thinking as they relate to social and cultural experience, including literary criticism.

REQUIREMENTS:

Weekly assignments (writing skills, library instruction, attendance, journal, etc.)..	20%
1 in-class essays (min. 1.3 pages) at various times in each section.....	10%
1st formal essay (min. 4 pages double spaced) due Oct. 9.....	25%
2 nd researched essay (min. 6 pages) due Nov. 15/16.....	35%
Final in-class essay last day of class (min 1.3 pages).....	10%

Essays lose substantial grades if they are less than the minimum length. (One should not include quoted support in calculating minimum length). All essays, except in-class assignments, must be typed. MLA standards are required for documentation and format. The instructor must be notified in advance of unavoidable absences. Students that miss several classes may be requested to withdraw from the course due to the great difficulty in catching up on concepts missed. Assignments must be handed in on the date due to avoid specified penalties. ***Penalties for plagiarism (see definition in Student Handbook) are enforced*** and plagiarism is reported to administration. Essays more than 3 days late may not be accepted without prior permission. Late essays will be penalized.

BE= The Bare Essentials: Form B 6th ed.– **weekly exercises** or **alternative assignments**, indicated by bold print (**BE pg#**), ***are due at my office Wed. 10 AM of the week due.*** *BE* exercises are to be done in the workbook itself, to be corrected, torn out, stapled, and handed in. No credit is lost for mistakes, but no credit is given for the assignment if it is not self-corrected (checks and revisions) in a contrasting colour of ink or pencil. Up to a maximum of 1% can be lost if all assignments are not done completely with contrasting corrections, checkmarks, etc. When weekly assignments are worth more than 1% of the final course grade, that is indicated in the outline. Since part of each weekly assignment is to be in class and taking notes in your journal, **1% is lost** for missing 2 classes. **One half of 1 % is lost** for each class missed, or for not participating by taking notes in the journal for any given class. Notes need not be in sentences or intelligible to anyone but you. Journals will be handed in at the instructor's discretion.
