Description: This course covers aspects of bacterial physiology such as nutrient uptake, metabolism, extracellular proteins, chemotaxis and differentiation. The eukaryotic microbes, their ecological roles and eukaryotic cell culture will be discussed. The interactions of microbes with the environment and symbiotic relationships are major topics. Basic principles of industrial microbiology and the use of biotechnology for the production of economically and medically important substances will be covered. Laboratory exercises deal with topics related to the lecture material.
