# **DELIVERY MODE(S):** Lecture

**COURSE OBJECTIVES:** This Rudiments of Music course will enable students to understand the language of music and decipher the basic symbols of reading and musicianship.

**LEARNING OUTCOMES:** Through aural and printed exercises, it is expected that all students upon course completion will be able to:

- -Notate and read music in treble, bass, and C clefs.
- -Identify and write simple intervals.
- -Identify and write the following types of scales: major, minor, pentatonic, whole tone, chromatic, blues, and modes of major.
- -Identify and write rhythms in simple, compound and hybrid meters.
- -Identify and write triads, dominant seventh, and diminished seventh chords.
- -Perform basic transposition and score analysis.
- -Identify cadences.
