CALENDAR DESCRIPTION: The fundamentals of music theory are approached through aural and written training.

PREREQUISITE/COREQUISITE: No previous knowledge of music is required.

DELIVERY MODE(S): Remote Lecture

COURSE OBJECTIVES: The purpose of the course is to provide the students with equivalent of Royal Conservatory Level 8 or Conservatory Canada Grade 4 Theory. This level of theory is necessary to qualify a student to take MU1550 and the other university level music courses.

LEARNING OUTCOMES: Students will demonstrate the ability to (a) notate music in treble, bass, and C clefs: (b) identify all intervals in the range from P1-P8 either ascending or descending; (c) build and identify scales including major, minor, chromatic, whole tone, pentatonic, blues, and major modes; (d) notate rhythms in simple time, compound time, and hybrid metres; (e) notate chords including triads, dominant and diminished 7th chords; (f) transpose by interval; (g) identify cadences; (h) read scores; and (i) do harmonic analysis.
