**CALENDAR DESCRIPTION:** Students will gain experience performing ensemble literature from a variety of periods and genres. Students are required to participate in an ensemble related specifically to their field of study. This is a two-term course offered over Fall/Winter terms. It is identifiable in the Schedule of Courses (Timetable) with a Part A and a Part B. Students music register in both the Part A and the Part B of all types of sections offered (sections, labs, seminars, etc.) for this course.

**PREREQUISITE(S)/COREQUISITE:** Consent of department based upon audition.

**REQUIRED TEXT/RESOURCE MATERIALS:** Musical instrument and accessories. Music for concerts is provided.

**DELIVERY MODE(S):** Rehearsal-Performance

**COURSE OBJECTIVES:** The course involves working with the student on experience with musical terms, conducting, rehearsal techniques, playing techniques, intonation, subdivision, and playing in a group.

**LEARNING OUTCOMES:** The development of playing skills to match the difficulty of the music. The band performs university-level music including a variety of styles, periods, and genres for each concert. Each year includes orchestral transcriptions, original band works, solo literature with band, and works from 1700s to the present. There is a conscious attempt to perform music from a

variety or countries including the United States, Canada, United Kingdom, France, Germany, Italy, Russia, Australia, and Japan as well as other countries from time to time.
