1. Course Description: A continuation of the study of common practice harmony and the analysis of larger forms and writing in a variety of textures

2. The Course in Perspective: Late 19th-century harmony, an introduction to the contrapuntal technique of the 18th and 19th centuries, and an introduction to analytical techniques used in 20th-century composition become the focus of this course.

3. Assignments: Students will be required to complete and hand in regular assignments that are given in their texts. From time to time, students will be given compositional assignments.

5. Grading: The student's grade will be determined by the following weighting:

- A. 70% for regular class assignments.
- B. 30% for final examination.
